

In 1995, the Chorale traveled to Europe, performing benefit concerts to sold-out audiences in Barcelona, Berlin and Prague. TCC also has performed for notables including the Queen of England and former President George Bush. The Chorale, with 23 CDs to date, is the most recorded male chorus in history, and is featured on the EMMY award-winning PBS documentary, "After Goodbye: An AIDS Story." Turtle Creek Chorale also holds the Guinness World Record for the Longest Continuous Choral Concert: 20 hours and 23 seconds.

THE WOMEN'S CHORUS OF DALLAS The Women's Chorus of Dallas (TWCD) has entered its twelfth season with more than 120 dedicated singers, eight compact discs, a strong history of community service and growing recognition as one of the nation's finest women's choruses. TWCD provides musical excellence and quality entertainment through a wide range of repertoire including classical, sacred, pop and show tunes. The Women's Chorus of Dallas has maintained a close association with The Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation and has been featured at a number of the Foundation's events.

DR. TIMOTHY SEELIG conductor Since becoming Artistic Director of TCC in 1987 and TWCD in 1994, Dr. Timothy Seelig has led the choruses in a number of significant achievements and has developed an active performance schedule with other arts organizations nationwide. Dr. Seelig is both performer and educator. He holds the Master of Music and the Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from the University of North Texas as well as the Diploma in Lieder and Oratorio from the Mozarteum in Salzburg, Austria. Dr. Seelig is also a member of the music faculty of Southern Methodist University, and received the 1995 President's Citation as Distinguished Alumnus from The University of North Texas.

PAMELA MARTIN

Pamela Martin is a widely published lyricist who has collaborated with many composers and currently has more than 70 pieces with several major publishers. Her work is widely diverse and crosses the educational and sacred boundaries. While devoting her time to Sing for the Cure, she interviewed men and women from across the United States; many of their stories are the inspiration in this work. Mrs. Martin is a frequent speaker on the art of lyric writing. She lives in Austin, Texas, with her husband, composer Joseph Martin, and their children.
