The Turtle Creek Chorale

The Turtle Creek Chorale's 2002-2003 Season marks the Chorale's 23rd Anniversary. Founded in 1980 by two gentlemen after church choir rehearsal, the first Turtle Creek Chorale concert took place on June 24, 1980, in Caruth Auditorium at Southern Methodist University when fifty-five men took the stage to present, "The Last Words of David."

The repertoire of the TCC can be described as eclectic in the finest sense of the word – creative, diverse, and original. The Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center serves as the

primary venue for Chorale performances.

The Chorale has traveled to Europe, performing benefit concerts to sold out audiences in Barcelona, Berlin, and Prague. With a portfolio of twenty-nine CD's, the Chorale is the most recorded male chorus in history. In an effort to collaborate with other arts organizations, the TCC has performed with: The Dallas Black Dance Theater, The Dallas Symphony Orchestra, The Dallas Opera, The Dallas Wind Symphony, and The Anita N. Martiznez Ballet Folkorico, to name a few.

Milestones in the life of the Turtle Creek Chorale include:

Performances include two appearances at Carnegie Hall and a European Tour.

In collaboration with the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, created "Sing For The Cure: A Proclamation of Hope," narrated by Dr. Maya Angelou.

Created and presented the world premiere of "Song of Wisdom from Old Turtle," based on the award-winning book Old Turtle. Narrated by Marlo Thomas, a portion of all recording proceeds benefits St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

The PBS documentary, "After Goodbye: An AIDS Story," featuring the Turtle Creek Chorale, received nine national awards, including an EMMY.

Performed for both President George H. W. Bush and Queen Elizabeth of England

Ranked in the top ten of Billboard Classical Charts based on the "Requiem" CD

In a single evening's benefit performance on September 15, 2001, the TCC raised over \$15,000 for the World Trade Center relief efforts in New York.

With a mission to enhance the musical and cultural lives of its audience while promoting harmony and goodwill throughout the world, the men of the Turtle Creek Chorale recognize and embrace the privilege they have been given to build bridges to a greater awareness, understanding and respect for our shared humanity.

Throughout the ages, the human race has been enamored with the stars, moon and planets. This fascination has permeated all forms of art, especially poetry and music. A year ago, we began gathering selections based on the heavenly bodies and our concept of heaven itself.

The result of our search was a host of premiers and commissions as well as selections already in the male chorus repertoire. We had no idea that during our rehearsal/performance period, we would lose seven astronauts directly over our heads on a crystal clear morning nor that the U.S. would be at war.

These events certainly gave new meaning and depth of understanding to the music and the texts. The Turtle Creek Chorale attempts to perform repertoire that is both moving and timely. Seldom have circumstances fallen together in such a manner.

Our hope is that through this recording of our performances and specifically through our delivery of these texts through music, you will find peace and solace in this unsettled world.
