After earning undergraduate degrees in both Economics and Music, Reuben received his Master of Music degree from Louisiana State University where he was teaching assistant to New York Metropolitan Opera soprano Martina Arroyo, and was on the conducting staff of the Baton Rouge Lyric Opera. He has continued doctoral studies at UMKC Conservatory of Music. Reuben has served as Music Director of the Kansas City Civic Opera Theatre and he was Music Director and Conductor of the Heartland Men's Chorus from 1989-1998. He was also Conductor of the Philharmonia of Kansas City.

Chad Weirick, Principal Accompanist and Assistant Music Director

Chad Weirick was born in Rockford, Illinois. A five-time winner of the Illinois State Fair organ competition, he went on to become organist for Radio City Music Hall and the rehearsal pianist for the Rockettes. He has performed as a keyboardist for the Broadway productions of A Chorus Line, The Act, and Shenandoah. He graduated with honors and distinction in performance from New England Conservatory of Music, with a degree in composition. In addition to teaching, Chad tours the United States playing theater organ concerts and accompanying silent films.
