

Greetings and welcome to the sounds of the 2005 Auburn University Marching Band! Founded in 1897, the members of the Auburn University Marching Band are a diverse group of students, ranging from all academic areas within the university and many states throughout our country, with the majority of our students from our home state of Alabama. We are proud of the diversity of students that comprise the outstanding bands of Auburn University. This year, the AUMB was the largest in school history; three hundred and forty-two members strong.

This year's CD has a special treat for all Auburn fans! In 1954, longtime Auburn supporter Mr. Roy Sewell suggested that Auburn needed a new fight song. To produce the new song, he commissioned New York composer Robert Allen, along with lyricist Al Stillman, to write the words and music. The new song was completed in the summer of 1955 and Mr. Sewell wrote, 'Boy, we have a peach of a song!' It was played by the Auburn Band for the first time in Cliff Hare Stadium over 50 years ago on September 24, 1955. The occasion was the Auburn-Chattanooga football game, the opening game of the 1955 season. Over the years, the 'new Auburn song' has been played and sung countless times... after touchdowns, in pre-game and halftime shows, at all kinds of other sporting events, and any time or place Auburn people gather. It has taken its place deep in the heart of Auburn traditions. The new Auburn song was, of course, WAR EAGLE.

2005 was an AUsome year for the Auburn University Marching Band. In early January we were at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, LA and less than three weeks later the AUMB performed live for President George W. Bush at the 55th Presidential Inaugural Parade in Washington, D.C.

This fall we introduced the Tiger Eyes to the AU Marching Band family. The Tiger Eyes are the fabulous young women of our visual ensemble, including our majorette, flag, and inaugural dance line. These ladies entertained thousands of people with dazzling color and amazing choreographed routines, coordinating their efforts into one unified visual effect. They are the "sights" of the AUMB.

This year we also welcomed Dr. Doug Rosener, Assistant Director of Bands and Percussion Professor, to our AU Band staff. Doug finished his doctorate in percussion performance from the University of Colorado this past December. He is an extremely talented individual and a welcome addition to the staff. He has done a tremendous job in his first year, and we look forward to working with him for many more years to come.


