## ROBERT ESPINDOLA, Librettist

A professional educator and ordained minister, Robert graduated with honors from Graceland College in Lamoni, Iowa, in 1975. Upon completing graduate studies in psychology at the Universities of Illinois and San Francisco State, he taught in the California school system for twenty years. In 1992, he was honored as one of California's "Distinguished Educators." A strong advocate for teenagers living with HIV/AIDS, Robert has traveled throughout the U.S. and Canada conducting workshops and seminars and working with state legislators lobbying for the rights of minors impacted by HIV disease. Robert has been a keynote speaker at two national AIDS conferences, and in 1993, served as a delegate the International Conference on AIDS in Yokohama, Japan.

Robert and composer Robert Seeley began collaborating shortly after meeting in the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus in 1997. Their first work In This Heart Of Mine, was commissioned by the New York City Gay Men's Chorus, and has been recorded by the Turtle Creek Chorale. Robert has written the librettos for four other commissioned works: O Jubilant Day and Over the Skies of Yisrael for the Seattle Men's Chorus, With One Voice for the GALA 2000 Conference, and Exile for the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus.

#### ROBERT SEELEY, Composer

Robert graduated with distinction from California State University, Chico, with a Bachelor of Arts in Music Theory/Composition, and later taught music in the California public school system and at the community college level.

Although most of his current compositions are choral works, his background was in instrumental music. He also has a background in musical theater, performing both on stage and in theater orchestras, and has served as musical director for a number of productions in college and community theater.

Robert was a member of San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus from 1985 to 2001. In addition to composing for SFGMC, he has been commissioned by a number of other GALA Choruses throughout the years, including the New York City Gay Men's Chorus, the Gay Men's Chorus of Washington D.C., the Seattle Men's Chorus and The Women's Chorus of Dallas.
