Organized in 1985 at The University of Southern Mississippi by Larry D. Smith, Carillon consists of ringers selected annually by campuswide audition. Each year the choir performs 20-25 concerts for local to international audiences. Noteworthy appearances include performances at the National Director's Seminar for the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers in 1991 at Reston, Virginia, and in 1994 at Mobile, Alabama; at the Handbell Spectacular in 2001 at Palm Springs, California; and at Handbell Exploration in 2002 in Scottsdale, Arizona. Carillon has toured England, Bermuda, Germany, Japan, France, Switzerland, and Austria.

This recording features Carillon's 2002-2003 concert program performed on its March 2003 tour of Mississippi and Louisiana and its May 2003 tour to Princeton University and New York City Riverside Church.

The University of Southern Mississippi Carillon Handbell Choir performs on six full octaves plus C2, D2, E2, E flat 2 and F2 of Schulmerich handbells and five octaves of Schulmerich melody chimes. Carillon thanks Schulmerich Carillons, Incorporated, for its continued professional assistance.
